

OUTREACH NEWS January 2015

In November our Holiday Bazaar was a huge success. The final word is not in but it appears we made about \$11,000.

Also in November we provided Thanksgiving meals for 3 families at Sandymount Elementary School.

In December filled stockings and gifts for Angels were delivered to the Salvation Army. Even our youngest members (the Live Wires) helped by stuffing the stockings. Brad Scobie organized this activity and did a great job.

Three families at Sandymount School received Christmas gifts from our church. This event was organized by the awesome Paula Dinatale.

The Safe Haven Christmas Party sponsored by our church was held on December 22nd. There was delicious food; we played games and all residents received gifts. The youth of the church again this year contributed gifts for the residents. Thanks to Tina Von Gunten for another great party at Safe Haven.

For the first time this year our Youth did not adopted a human family for Christmas. Instead they adopted all of the animals at the Carroll County Humane Society. They visited the shelter on December 20th to deliver the gently used towels and other gifts for the animals and had a tour of the shelter. Becky Tesch and Audrey Boyle worked with the youth on this project.

The newest outreach activity was started in December and is headed by Audrey Boyle. Each 3rd Thursday of the month a group will visit Golden Acres assisted living home. There will be a brief message, singing and snacks. On December 18th a group visited the home and sang Christmas carols and had holiday snacks.

This is the close of our Outreach Programs for 2014. Our team is so grateful for the giving attitude of this church. We make every effort to design our Outreach programs to fit what our members can support. Our job is made a lot easier with the generosity of this congregation.

Our first Outreach Program in 2015 will be a sock drive for the Cold Weather Shelter. You may want to start watching for sales on white tube or athletic socks.

Flash – Finance Committee Starts Capital Campaign

The Finance Committee will start a 'Capital Campaign' starting in January to fund two urgent projects. We need to raise approximately \$35,000 to fund these projects recommended by our trustees.

The trustees presented both capital improvement projects to the Administrative Council at the December meeting. Each project is urgent in nature and both were approved by the council. The first project is the replacement of the audio system used in the sanctuary, at a cost of \$17,458. The second project involves replacement of all the overhead fluorescent light fix-tures throughout the entire church complex, at a cost to the church of \$28,945. The lighting project will actually cost only \$19,290 because of a rebate program offered by BGE. The finance committee has identified the funds necessary to make the initial deposit for each project from within our current budget.

A/V Solutions of Pennsylvania has been awarded the contract for the replacement of the audio system and we estimate completion in mid-February. The new system is necessary because:

1. The current system is ten years old and is rapidly failing. It has already been repaired several times.

2. The audio system is used at both services and is an integral part of our worship experience.

3. The new system will be digital and wireless and eliminate the need for all the wires on the floor presently found around the altar. These wires present a tripping hazard to the members of the Praise Team, the choir or other members performing in the front of the church, the congregation during communion, and our youth when at the altar during the Children's Message.

The lighting contract has been awarded to George Klinger Electrical and will start sometime in January. The rebate offered by BGE required that we be under contract by December 31st to qualify for the program.

1. The lights in the older part of the church complex will be replaced because the ballast used in those fixtures contain PCB's and are a health hazard to everyone using the building.

2. The fixtures in the newer Educational wing will be retro fitted to match the new fixtures used in the older portion of the complex at a cost savings to us.

3. The new fixtures will mean a 10 to 12 percent savings in the lighting portion of our monthly electric bill.

Everyone is urged to be as generous as possible as soon as possible. All donations are tax deductible and, if made by December 31st, qualify for the 2014 tax year. We are also able to accept stock which the finance committee can then convert to cash. More info to follow.
