Message from the Pastor



Theme: "like fire shut up in my bones."



This year's annual conference had a different feel to it. It was not as heavy, bogged down with the heaviness and anticipation of tense debates over disaffiliation and the theological debate over the language in the discipline around the inclusion of LBGTQ members of the church in ordination and pastoral duties.

As always there were classes for all to register to learn from. The workshops include.

Gardens in the desert: how the adaptive church can lead to a whole new life: a vision for how we become god's church now for god's intended future.

The speaker is senior pastor Rev. Michael beck at St. Paul UMC in Ocala, fl. He directs fresh expressions initiatives for discipleship ministries, speaks and teaches at seminaries, churches, and conferences, and is the author of multiple books from Abingdon press.

The second workshop was the art of neighboring: reimaging church in our literal neighborhoods.

Leader: Cristin Cooper is the owner of Coop's Soups and a licensed local pastor, focusing on fresh expressions, in the Baltimore Washington conference. She is also a successful fresh expressions practitioner, guides participants through a deeplistening practice to reveal the places in our neighborhoods where neighbors could with a little creativity and a genuine community partnership or two – encounter god's grace and grow in deeper intimacy with god's love.

Becoming yourself: an introduction to positive intelligence

Leader: Rev. Rod Miller is a positive intelligence coach and a long-time pastor and coach in the Baltimore Washington conference.

Bless: five everyday ways to love your neighbor and change the world.

Learn five practical practices you can use to bless and reach people outside the church and the faith.

Leader: Rev. Bill Brown is the director of innovative evangelism for the Baltimore Washington conference.

Connecting for change: introduction to missional action planning (map)

Leader: Rev. Dr. Joseph W. Daniels, Jr. is lead pastor of Emory UMC in Washington dc and a map consultant for the Baltimore Washington and Peninsula-Delaware conferences.

How 'truth or dare' can lead to birthing a fresh expression

Leaders: Raimon Jackson, creator of the well, is a spiritual entrepreneur and innovative pioneer in the field of fresh expressions. Taeron Fleming, co-leader at the well, is a creative leader in ministry and fresh expressions with experience in pastoring cross-cultural ministries.



Living well: a holistic approach to a balanced life

Leaders: the living well team is a group of clergies from across the BWC/pen-del affiliation.

The power of prayer in congregational transformation and outreach.

Leader: Rev. Lillian C. Smith is the Pastor of Cheverly UMC, a congregational developer, and a person who has a desire for every person to embrace and live out their God-given call.

The state of humanitarian immigration

Leader: Sarah Selim Milad is the managing attorney of MD & DC, just neighbors and a graduate of the American University, Washington college of law. As an immigrant from Egypt, Sarah resonates with the plight of immigrants fleeing persecution and feels privileged to serve them.

Funding ministry through planned giving, endowments, and major gifts

Leaders will be from the Mid-Atlantic foundation.

A new retirement plan for clergy called compass was approved by the general conference. BWC restructures for discipleship

BWC's plan for restructuring took another step forward as members voted to move from eight (8) districts to six (6).

The plan includes structure for increased missional impact and vitality.

The plan goes beyond simply redistricting. There are three main components.

Five to twelve local churches will be grouped in a collaborative hub in a shared, geographically based mission field. Each hub will have a designated connecting church, to facilitate collaborative work and vitality.

A group of hubs will be organized in one of six non-geographic districts, based on the population density. This will create opportunities to network across perceived boundaries and learn from one another in diverse, yet similar, contexts.

The hubs and districts will be organized into two administrative regions, supported by a centralized administrative team.

The grouping of hubs begins this June with information gathering. A list of hubs will be published in January 2025. Also, in January, the boundaries of the administrative regions will be announced. A list of churches in each district is expected to be published in March 2025. The annual conference will be held next year, in May 2025 and restructuring will become fully operational on July 1, 2025.

GC2020 calls for regionalization.

The postponed 2020 general conference was held in charlotte, N.C. the conference made headlines by removing restrictive language about LGBTIQ people from church law, adopting a new set of social principles, and approving a plan for regionalization.

Regionalization will require a constitutional amendment. It must be voted on by every annual conference and receive two-thirds of all votes cast by all annual conferences worldwide in aggregate to pass.

If passed, it will restructure the denomination to be more contextual in different regions of the world served by the church. the current central conferences in Africa, the Philippines, Europe, and the us would become regional conferences with the same authority to pass legislation for greater missional impact. The BWC, like others, will not vote on regionalization until the 2025 annual conference session. Two additional amendments to the denomination's constitution will also be considered next year.

To welcome people into church membership regardless of gender or ability, And strengthen the denomination's stance against racism and colonialism.



Instant Church Directory - ACCESS DIRECTIONS

- 1. <u>Via Computer</u> through your browser, go to <u>Members.InstantChurchDirectory.com</u> for your initial visit, click on the words "create a login now" and follow the directions. <u>Note</u>: the email address that you use, <u>must</u> be one that you have provided to us for publication in the directory this is how you are verified as an authorized user. If the email address doesn't match, no verification link will be sent. after you click "request login", you will receive an email confirmation with a link to click on which will bring you back to the website. enter your email address and a password that you create, and click "sign in" for future visits, just sign in using this same password.
- 2. Via Mobile App If you have a smartphone, ipad, Kindle Fire, etc. you can view the directory through the mobile device. Under your "applications" icon, search for "Instant Church Directory". Download the app it's free. You will then be prompted for your email address (which, as specified above, must be one that you have given us to list in the directory this is how the directory remains secure so that only church members can access it). You will receive an email containing an auto-generated password. Return to the mobile app and enter this password. The directory will now be an icon on your device and will automatically update whenever changes are made by the administrator. Note: If you "sign out", you will have to go through this process again. You can close the icon without "signing out" though.


