## Message from the Pastor



Brothers and sisters in Christ,

It has been a long spring and summer for me. I had a shoulder replacement in March, rehab, and three steroid injections to calm the nerves in my left hand with a setback that caused me to raise my hand slightly above my head. And to make things worse, there is a possibility of more surgery on my rotator cuff. If it were not for Aleve, I do not know what I would do. Two critical dates: Friday, August 23, 2024, and Friday, August 30, 2024. I have nerve testing on August 23<sup>rd</sup> and an MRI on August 30<sup>th</sup>.

I am grateful to God for a wonderful woman who, despite my stupidity, continues to care for me. God is moving in our church— bringing visitors. We pray they will join us. Thank you for loving them and sharing radical hospitality with them. You have made them feel the love of God. Thank you, Lord, for sharing your love as we continue to lift you up. You promised in John 12:32 – "And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." (NIV) The promise is being lived out through you.

Let us keep lifting Jesus and allowing the Holy Spirit to flow freely from each of us to our communities.

For Radical Hospitality to flourish, we must shift our focus outward to the communities around us. I propose developing a Shalom Zone, an area that Sandy Mount claims to minister to.

A Telephone Prayer line will be established in mid-September so we can pray with and for each other. Watch for the number.

We must change the Bible Study start date as the source material is on backorder. Sandy Mount will order the books and have them available to purchase. Constant Contact will be sent when the order arrives.

Continue to pray for me as I pray for you.


