Donating supplies to the crafters Washing dishes


Making pumpkin rolls Securing the vendors Scheduling volunteers

The Giving Tree is *Sandy Mount's* method of delivering *Christmas Outreach*. The idea behind it is to provide you with choices about where you want to direct your help, without making you feel pressured that something new is being asked every time you turn around. The "*Ornaments*" on the tree represent items that we are collecting to support the following charities this Christmas:

Sandymount Elementary School Sandy Mount UMC Food Pantry Carroll County Veterans Independence Project (VIP)

Select an "ornament" or "ornaments" from the **Giving Tree** located in the Narthex. Purchase the item (s) requested and place your unwrapped donation in the designated box located under the tree. "Ornaments" can be returned to the collection box by the tree so that they can be used again.

We are sponsoring 3 families at *Sandymount Elementary School (SES)* this year, and *Pam Haines* will be providing a detailed sign-up sheet of items needed, which will be located either in the Narthex or main hallway. Please sign up for the item(s) you are willing to provide. They should be returned <u>wrapped</u> with a note indicating the family and child that they are for. The sign-up sheet will indicate the due date and where they should be placed. Please see *Pam* if you have any questions about how *SES* works.

We are collecting non-perishable food items for our *Food Pantry*. This is an on-going need, and since the *Food Pantry* is on site, there is no due date. "*Ornaments*" represent items that are most needed.

VIP is in need of toiletry items for the Veterans that they serve. Donations can be either full or travel size. We are also collecting items for their coffee station. Please have donations in by <u>December 15th</u> so they can be delivered to *VIP* well before Christmas.

The "envelopes" on the tree provide an opportunity to offer financial support without having to go out and shop for something. Money can be designated to purchase gifts for SES families, items for the Food Pantry, toiletries for VIP, or for General Outreach to be used where needed. Just indicate how you would like your donation to be directed, enclose cash, or check payable to SMUMC, and place the envelope in the offering plate on Sunday morning, give to Kara Urban, or place in the office in-box.

Wednesday, at 9:30 am. Doug Brooks has a long tradition of providing this worship opportunity for Sandy Mount.


